## Solo dads favour full-time work

SINGLE dads in Sutherland Shire prefer to work full-time.

None of the 26 dads with dependent children looking for work in the week before the 2011 census were seeking a part-time role, figures from the Australian Bureau of Statistics showed.

In stark contrast, 200 of the 292 unemployed single mums of dependent children looking for work were seeking a part-time job.

Kathryn MacMillian, the managing director of Nine2Three Employment Solutions in Sutherland, a recruitment company that matches employees with flexibletype roles in accounting and administration, was not surprised by the findings, saying most of her single-parent clients were women seeking part-time roles.
